


AWG Banner

This lesson will use photoshop and indesign to create a banner for AWG

Setup your work environment




Load your images in Bridges






Locate images and then Return to Photoshop by pressing the boomerang.




Open each template image






Start with the thorn shape and rotate and erase the background using the background erase tool.




Use the magic wand to select the thorn, then go to Select in the menu and choose Inverse





Use the Background Erase tool to erase the background.




Go to select and select the inverse again, Choose Filter and Filter Gallery






Select a filter and continue to adjust until you like the looks of the filter.



You can layer a filter on top of another filter by adding the paper at the bottom of the screen.

Time to save the image Go to File Save As



You can either start with the base image or continue to work from the modified image.







Select Custom for Document Size and Double the Height



Change the background Color to one that appeals to you.










Set Gradient Tool using Properties on the right






Start Placing your objects, 1 each in a layer






Lock Layer 1 and Move Layer 2 to the top






Add the next Image and Flip it Horizontally and Fit Content to Frame






Add Effects to the Elements




Use Adobe Folio to Preview your work and look for problems.





Use the Edit Original on the Right Click to clean problem areas.



This will open the image in Photoshop and the change will be instantaneous.
