



# Educator's Guide to ePortfolios using Google Sites and Blogger

## Overview:

Students will learn to set-up an eportfolio to organize and display their work as well as using a blog for reflection and processing of learning.

9-12

- Student can sync Google Password and District Password
- Student can set-up and maintain their Google Site
- Student can layout their Google Site as an ePortfolio
- Student can set-up a blog on Blogger
- Student can organize their Blog and add the feed to their Google Site

2 60 minute lessons

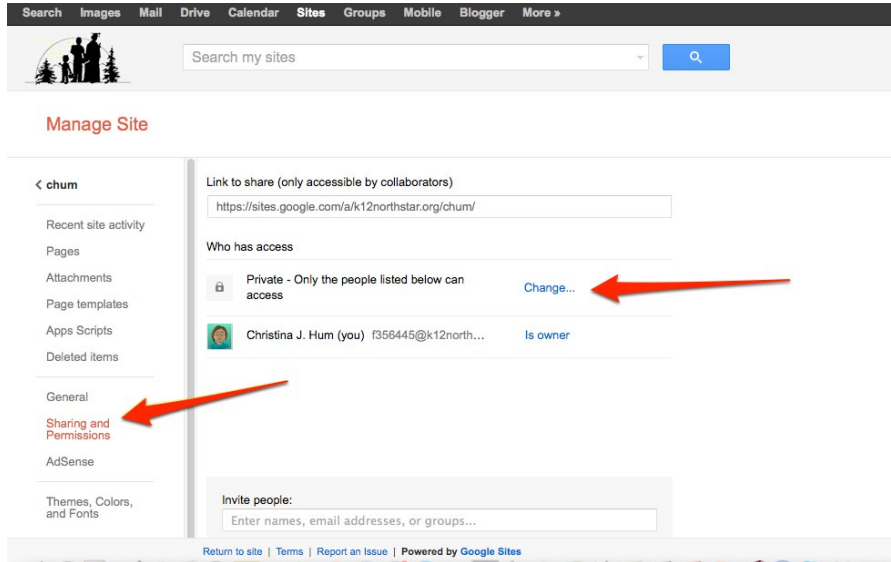
### Directions:

Step 1: Sync Google Sites Account (See handout here:

Step 2: Setup Google Site: <https://sites.google.com/site/plgl2550/creating-your-portfolio-using-google-sites>

Be sure to make the site private:



Step 3: Organize site with the following set-up

- Create a first page as an introduction and table of contents
- Set up a structure around the goals/themes identified in purpose statement
- One page for each goal/theme with links to first page
- Upload artifacts to page or create hyperlinks to documents online from Google Docs
- Write reflections about how the artifacts demonstrate achievement of goals
- Write future learning goals

Step 4: Setup Blogger Blog:

Step 5: Organize your blog and create your first entry.

Step 6: Add the rss feed to your Google Site by adding an RSS widget to your Google Site :
